Parking near school

Staffordshire Police has received an increasing number of complaints in relation to parking around the school.

The safety of the children is our top priority and if the problems continue we will have to consider enforcement.

You don't want drivers to put your children at risk so please ensure you are not putting other people's children at risk by parking illegally or inconsiderately.

Pavements are constructed and provided for pedestrian use and vehicles parked on pavements cause an obstruction. It is dangerous for pedestrians, wheelchair and pushchair users who may have to go onto the road to get past, putting them at risk.

For your own safety, pedestrians and other road users please show some consideration when driving and parking. When parking, please ensure you do not have to reverse onto the main road as this causes congestion and obstruction.

It is extremely important to ensure your children are properly strapped in when in the car, either in suitable child seats or booster seats, if they are too small to wear the seat-belts.

Not having your children safely strapped in is an offence - as well as putting your child at risk of being badly injured - or worse - in the event of a collision.
